Accomplishment Report 1st Quarter CY 2018

A. INTRODUCTION

The Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB), as the lead agency tasked to conserve biodiversity, is mandated to conserve and protect the country's biological diversity, and sustainably manage and conserve the important resources and ecosystem services they provide. The Bureau is tasked to formulate and recommend policies and programs which will strengthen the implementation of the National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) and other effective area-based conservation measures; and mainstreaming of biodiversity across local, sectoral and national development plans and programs.

B. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

V. Conservation of Threatened Wildlife

The Bureau was able to continuously monitor and provide guidance to Regional Offices in the conservation and management of threatened species, i.e. marine turtle, dugong, Philippine raptors. The Bureau also provided assistance in addressing the technical and administrating concerns of the Palawan Wildlife Rescue and Conservation Center (PWRCC) – Crocodile Farming Project, and the National Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation Center (NWRRC).

A. Wildlife Regulation and Enforcement

Animal Care and Maintenance

The Wildlife Rescue Center (WRC) serves as a temporary refuge and rehabilitation facility for confiscated, turned-over, donated and/or abandoned wildlife. For the months of January to March 2018, WRC received a total of 517 different animals, to wit: 138 mammals (110 confiscated), 284 birds (197 confiscated), and 95 reptiles (1 retrieved).

Animal Inventory

- For the first quarter of 2018, WRC recorded 290 animal mortalities, to wit: 25 mammals (13 new stocks), 113 birds (61 new stocks), 113 reptiles (3 new stocks), and 39 arthropods;
- As of March 31, 2018, WRC houses a total of 1,360 different animals, broken down as follows: 23 arthropods, 251 mammals, 530 birds and 556 reptiles.

Specifically, the workshop aims to: (i) Update the CMEMP Logical Framework; (ii) Discuss the Monitoring and Evaluation Plan; and, (iii) 2018 Implementation Strategies.

B. Coastal and Marine Habitat Assessment

In partnership with GIZ, habitat assessment field guide for each habitat were developed. Also, several meetings were conducted in order to finalize layout design of each field guide.

C. Coral Assessment for Rehabilitation Enhancement: Capability Development and Resiliency of Ecosystems (CARE-CaDRES)

- Various equipment to be used by the different sub-projects under CARE-CaDRES have already been purchased and distributed to respective project teams;
- Held meetings with UP-MSI last 12 February and 27 February that discussed the no-cost extension, approval of the third tranche and budget realignment of the project;
- Conducted the Third Biodiversity Resource Information Network Group Training on Marine Biodiversity Management last 19-23 February, 2018 at Dohera Hotel, Mandaue City, Cebu;
- In line with the Implementation of CARE-CaDRES Project of the Bureau conducted the 3rd Formation and Organization Workshop for the Biodiversity Resource Information Network Group (BRING) last March 6-10, 2018 at the Dohera Hotel, Mandaue City, Cebu. It was attended by the respective DENR Regional and/or Field Office together with DENR-ERDB, DENR-BMB, DOST, Academe, and Civil Society Organizations. The BRING Organizational Structure has been drafted.

D. Asia-Pacific Coral Reef Symposium (APCRS)

- Memorandum sent to the Regional Offices to submit abstracts under the session topics for the hosting of the 4th Asia-Pacific: Working together amidst contemporary challenges on 4-8 June 2018.
- Conducted Local Organizing Committee Meeting last March 16, 2018 wherein the Bureau discussed and provided updates among the members of the LOC the following particulars: work and financial plan, Memorandum of Agreement, BAC Resolution, Terms of Reference and justification of BMB for engaging UP, certificate/clearance, hotel contract, purchase request for venue, meeting packages, accommodation of VIPs, participation of DENR regional and field staff, BMB exhibit/booth, press conference, plenary presentation, welcome dinner, recognition dinner, post-symposium tour, etc.

E. Snake Island

Snake Island Operational Plan was subjected to consultation among concerned stakeholders
last January 26, 2018 at Best Western Plus Hotel in Puerto Princesa, Palawan. Some of the
agreements during the consultation which will be incorporated in the revise draft are: a)
revision of the organizational structure of the Operational Plan involving all the stakeholders
who commit to take part under the institutional partners category and elaborate on each and
everyone's roles and responsibilities; b) declaration of snake island as marine sanctuary with
all areas as no take zone including the reef areas surrounding the island; c) clear delineation

of boundaries of Snake Island; d) removal of the ecotourism component in the Snake Island Operational Plan;

 Conduct a separate meeting with the Local Government Unit of Puerto Princesa for the proper delineation of boundaries of snake island was tentatively scheduled on February 2018 while the next consultation meeting will be on June 2018.

F. CTI-CFF

 Terms of Reference (TOR) of the Consultant who will draft the Term of Reference (TOR) for the Review of the RPOA

The Philippines as the current Chair of the Monitoring and Evaluation Group (MEWG) was instructed by the Committee of Senior Officials to finalize and approve the TOR of the Consultant who will draft the TOR for the Review of the Regional Plan of Action (RPOA) in coordination with the Australian Government and the CTI-CFF Regional Secretariat. Based on the approved TOR, Peter Thomas was selected to draft the TOR for the review of the RPOA. Peter Thomas already submitted the Brief for the Review of the RPOA for comments of the CT6 Countries

Terms of Reference of the External Auditor to Conduct the Special and Regular Audit

As agreed during the 13th SOM, the Terms of Reference of the External Auditor who will conduct the 2015 and 2016 Special Audit and 2017 Regular Audit shall be finalized and approved. Relative thereto, the PH-NCCC reviewed the draft TOR and submitted the comments and recommendations to the CTI-Regional Secretariat. Thereafter, the CTI-RS considered all the comments from the Philippines and circulated the final version of the draft TOR for approval of the CSO of each CT6 Countries.

 1st Philippine National CTI Coordinating Committee (PH NCCC) Meeting: Post-13th SOM Assessment

The Philippine National CTI Coordinating Committee (Ph-NCCC) conducted the 1st NCCC Meeting back to back with Post 13th SOM Assessment and Planning Workshop for 2018. During the said meeting, the highlights and agreements during the 13th SOM were presented; the action points for the Philippines; developments after the 13th SOM and its current status were discussed. Further, details on the reply of the Regional Secretariat regarding the letter from the Committee of Senior Officials was also discussed and agreed that the Philippines shall submit a position paper regarding that matter in consultation with the Department of Foreign Affairs. PH-NCCC also discussed the matter on the additional members of the NCCC. It was agreed that a Resolution will be issued by the NCCC requesting Department of Tourism (DOT) to become additional member of the NCCC.

G. Manila Bay

A cluster workshop was spearheaded by the Manila Bay Rehabilitation Project team and was conducted at Crown Royale hotel, Balanga, Bataan. The workshop was to populate the

monitoring system with the plans for 2018 of each cluster agencies and to present it to the group to give a grasp of the future of reporting accomplishments.

H. Philippine Rise and West Philippine Sea Expeditions

· International Year of the Reef

The International Year of the Reef (IYOR) is a year-long campaign of events and initiatives hosted by governments and non-governmental organizations around the world, to promote conservation action and strengthen long-term collaborations for coral reef conservation. *Message: TOGETHER in protecting our reefs*

The 2nd Partner's Meeting was conducted last 29 January 2018 wherein the DENR-BMB IYOR Road Map was presented and proposed activities from partners to be linked to the IYOR celebration were gathered. Special Events and Celebrations

World Wetlands Day

The Bureau celebrated the World Wetlands Day (WWD) last 2 February 2018 in Brgy. Sta. Lucia and in Brgy. San Bartolome, Quezon City with this year's theme "Wetlands for a Sustainable Future – Making urban cities liveable".

The Bureau, in partnership with the Society for the Conservation of Philippine Wetlands (SCPW), DENR National Capital Region (DENR-NCR), Mother Earth Foundation and the Environmental Protection and Waste Management Division (EPWMD) of the Quezon City LGU, organized an educational outreach for the communities living near the Tullahan River, which is one of the major waterways in Metro Manila draining into Manila Bay. This event includes lectures on the Seven Environmental Principles, Importance of Urban Wetlands and Zero Waste Management to raise public awareness on the significant role of urban wetlands in sustaining ecological balance. The participants discussed and shared their ideas on how to contribute to wetland/s conservation efforts by working together as a community, with the government and other sectors.

The Bureau hopes that this celebration will instill awareness and promote initiatives not only for the community of Tullahan River but also for the rest of the country on the wise use of wetlands for a sustainable urban future.

World Wildlife Day

The World Wildlife Day is celebrated on March 3, the day the landmark Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) was adopted in 1973. This year's theme is "Big cats: predators under threat."

The annual celebration, which started in 2014 following the declaration by the United Nations General Assembly on Dec. 20, 2013, aims to raise awareness of endangered animal and plant species, and ways to fight against wildlife crime.

The Philippines joins the global celebration as part of its commitment to the CITES, an international agreement to regulate worldwide commercial trade in animal and plant species.

Women's Month Celebration

The Biodiversity Management Bureau - Gender and Development (BMB-GAD) takes part in the celebration of Women's Month with the theme, "We Make Change Work for Women". The men and women of BMB kick-started Women's Month through a fun walk last March 8, 2018 held at the Ninoy Aquino Parks and Wildlife Grounds which also marks the annually observed International Women's Day.





Moreover, the Bureau spearheaded its 2nd year of Women's Forum with a theme of "Igniting Passion, Finding Fulfillment, Inspiring Stories of Women in Biodiversity" last March 23, 2018 at the Hive Hotel in Quezon City as part of the Women's Month Celebration Activity. The forum aims to highlight the accomplishments of women leaders in conserving biodiversity and enforcing environmental law. Also, this is to commend their extraordinary efforts on women empowerment in defending the environment.

VIII. Managing the Ninoy Aquino Parks and Wildlife Center

The Bureau continuously managed the 22.7 hectare Ninoy Aquino Parks and Wildlife Center (NAPWC). For the first quarter of 2018, a total of 82,973 visitors (male=39,999; female=42,974) were recorded generating a total income of ₱2,836,923.95.00 from the entrance, parking and rental fees of the park.
