# Accomplishment Report 1st Quarter CY 2021

#### A. INTRODUCTION

The Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) is the lead agency mandated to conserve and protect the country's biological diversity as well as to sustainably manage important resources and ecosystem services they provide. The Bureau is tasked to formulate and to recommend policies and programs which will strengthen the implementation of the National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) and other effective area-based conservation measures. The Bureau is also tasked in mainstreaming of biodiversity across local, sectoral and national development plans and programs.

# VI. MANAGING THE NINOY AQUINO PARKS AND WILDLIFE CENTER

The Bureau manages the 23.85-hectare Ninoy Aquino Parks and Wildlife Center (NAPWC). For the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of CY 2021, the following are the NAPWC accomplishments:

- Income generation
  - For the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter of CY 2021, a of 5,539 visitors (male= 2,512; female=3,027) were recorded generating a total income of Php 324,450 from the entrance, parking and rental fees of the park. NAPWC follows the strict protocols recommended by the IATF.

#### Park Maintenance

- Daily maintenance of the Park; maintenance of pocket landscapes, maintenance of MRF; re-painting of plant boxes, continuous hauling of wastes from the Park and BMB Offices, among others. Materials for landscaping were procured to improve the plant boxes located at the Cherry Lane
- On the maintenance of the NAPWC Nursery, the seedlings/saplings in the nursery were correctly identified and duly labeled. The activity was conducted with support from the Philippine Native Trees Enthusiasts on 01 March 2021.
- On the maintenance of the NAPWc Arboretum, continuous weeding and monitoring of the seedlings/saplings which were planted in the Arboretum in June 2020
- Continuous maintenance of the Sigla Project, an urban vegetable garden in support of the DA's plant, plant program
- Upcycling of felled trees from the preventive tree maintenance and silvicultural activity conducted in January and February 2021

## PA Activities

- Continual monitoring of the Informal Settler Families (ISF) Southwest portion. Ten ISF re-settled in Pandi, Bulacan, hence, NAPWC has to ensure that no new structure will be built in the vacated area.
- On-going demarcation of the NAPWC boundary. The project hit a bottleneck when the Technical Description is not the same (does not fall) on the "perimeter fence" of NAPWC. A "corner" is located along Elliptical Road. Witness monuments have to be installed.
- On PA Gallery, official follow-ups were made by the BMB (letters prepared by NAPWC) regarding the liquidation of the funds transferred to UP Diliman regarding the establishment of the PA Gallery/Museum.
- NAPWC conducted "PaSIKLABin ang pag-ibig ngayon buwan ng FEB-ibig!"to celebrate valentine's day.


