The Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB) is the lead agency tasked and mandated to conserve and to protect the country's biological diversity as well as to sustainably manage and to conserve the important resources and ecosystem services they provide. 


Figure 3. PA Talk. Episode 2: Participation of Local Communities in Protected Area Management




Figure 4. PA Talk. Episode 3: Ecotourism in Protected Areas
