TERMS OF REFERENCE

PROCUREMENT OF CONSULTANCY SERVICES (INDIVIDUAL) FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF SUPPLEMENTAL GUIDELINES ON ENHANCING BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION AND PROTECTION IN MINING OPERATIONS FOR THE DENR-UNDP/GEF PROJECT ON "INTEGRATED APPROACH IN MANAGEMENT OF BIODIVERSITY CORRIDORS IN THE PHILIPPINES"

I. Background

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), with funding from the Global Environment facility (GEF) and support from the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), is implementing the project entitled "Integrated Approach in Management of Major Biodiversity Corridors in the Philippines" or BD Corridor Project. The Project aims to operationalize integrated management of biodiversity corridors to generate multiple benefits including effective conservation of globally threatened species and high conservation value forests, reduce deforestation and degradation and enhance local biodiversity-friendly livelihoods. This Project has four components, namely:

- Component 1: Effective coordination and governance framework for integrated ecosystem management in the Philippines biodiversity corridors system.
- Component 2: Application of integrated network design and management of biodiversity corridors to ensure continued stability and sustainability of their biological, ecosystem services and socio-economic conservation values.
- Component 3: Community-based sustainable use and management systems in the two pilot biodiversity corridor systems in the Philippines; and
- Component 4: Knowledge management, gender mainstreaming, learning, monitoring and evaluation.

One of the Project's key results is to ensure coherence of actions among key stakeholders in the BD Corridors (eastern Mindanao and Central Mindoro) such that their activities and programs are aligned in support of the connectivity and integrity of ecosystem services in the corridors. In the Eastern Mindanao area, the activities of mining companies were identified as essential to bring about such integration. A key intervention is support to the implementation of DENR Department Administrative Order 2022-04 "Enhancing Biodiversity Conservation and Protection in Mining Operations" to further improve mining operation in the country and lessen its impact to biodiversity.

The BMB and MGB have already conducted series of consultations among DENR Field Offices in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao to present the salient features of the DAO 2022-04 and get feedback from field implementers. Based on these consultations, key stakeholders raised major points of clarification from various DENR Field Offices and some mining companies:

1. Guidelines in the identification of 5% reference ecosystem within or adjacent the tenement area;

- 2. Enhancement of guidelines for the rehabilitation of mined out areas;
- Enhancement of the (i) Tenement Safety, Health, Environment and Social Development (TSHES) Manual (ii) Environmental Protection and Enhancement Plan (EPEP) (iii) Social Development Management Plan (SDMP) (iv) Rehabilitation Plan for Mined-Out Areas
- 4. Revision on some provisions of the DAO 2022-04

The procurement of this consultancy service will facilitate the actions of the DENR in addressing these concerns and provide improved guidelines to facilitate compliance by mining companies on the requirements of the DAO 2022-04.

II. Objective

The objective of this Consultancy is to provide technical assistance to DENR in reviewing and enhancing provisions of DAO 2022-04, and capacitating the mining companies in complying with the said policy.

III. Scope of Work

The scope of work of this Terms of Reference is beyond the optimum in-house capability of the procuring entity and is consistent with the Government's policy not to compete with the private sector as integrated in Item 2 of Annex "B" of the 2016 Implementing Rules and Regulation of RA 9184.

Specifically, the scope of services is as follows:

- Review of related policies, guidelines, highlights of the results of consultations, Round Table Discussions (RTD), Cluster roll-outs, and other relevant documents pertaining to DAO 2022-04 and its implementation.
- Review, enhance and/or draft supporting guidelines, manuals and other relevant documents that will serve as a guide for mining companies to comply with DAO 2022-04 through strengthened BD measures in mining operations, including (i) TSHES Manual (ii) EPEP (iii) SDMP (iv) Rehabilitation Plan for Mined-Out Areas
- 3. Develop guidelines in identification and recognition 5% reference ecosystem within the tenement
- Facilitate discussions with mining companies and other stakeholders and develop capacity-building plan for the mining sector in relation to the provisions of the DAO 2022-04
- Act as Resource person during presentation of outputs/deliverables to NPB and TWG, and other events, as necessary;
- Coordinate with other project consultants and other offices, as maybe necessary, in the review and finalization of outputs and deliverables, and
- Perform other related tasks as may assigned by the National Project Director and National Project Manager.

- 2. Draft supplemental guidelines on
 - a. Identification and recognition of the 5% reference ecosystem
 - Revised TSHES Manual, EPEP and SDMP guidelines, and Rehabilitation Plan outline for Mined-Out Areas
- 3. Reports on the technical inputs provided to ERDB in the revision of the mining rehabilitation guidelines
- 4. Capacity-building plan and its implementation guidelines for the Mining Sector
- 5. Draft revised/enhanced version of DAO 2022-04

V. Qualifications and Requirements

- 1. At least Master' degree in forestry, mining, environment and natural resources management, and/or other related courses.
- 2. At least 5 years' experience in planning and managing NRM projects, mining operations and other environmental protection projects
- 3. Experience working with key lead implementing agencies including DENR, NCIP and/or other government agencies related to the nature of engagement.
- 4. Experience working with local government units, local communities and private sector related to the nature of engagement.
