SUBJECT: AMENDING DENR ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 14, SERIES OF 1991 "ESTABLISHING THE EL NIDO MARINE RESERVE"

In view of the recommendations of the Mayors of El Nido and Taytay and in order to address the livelihood opportunities of local bona fide residents of Barangay Liminangcong of the Municipality of Taytay, the following delineations of the map and provisions of the zoning plan under DENR Administrative Order No. 14, Series of 1991 "Establishing the El Nido Marine Reserve" are hereby amended, to wit:

Protection Zone: Area of Restricted Use (Site/Location) - Basnig fishing and squid gathering are allowed in the following areas:

North and South of Guntao Island, North and Southwestern of Tapiutan Island, North and Southeastern of Matinloc Island, Inambuyod, Cadlao, Dilumacad, Cauayan, Entaiula, Paglugaban and Caverna Islands.

"Protection Zone: Area of Restricted Use (Compatible Uses) - Sustenance and small scale fisheries for basnig fishing and squid gathering by bona fide residents of Liminangcong and duly accredited by the Reserve Authorities are allowed in the designated areas."

Multiple Use Area (Site/Location) - Basnig fishing and squid gathering are allowed in the following areas:


Islands within the multiple use area except Lagen and Malapacao Islands.

Multiple Use Area (Compatible Uses) - Sustenance and small scale fisheries for basnig fishing and squid gathering by bona fide residents of Liminangcong and duly accredited by the Reserve Authorities are allowed in the designated areas.

The revised map and amended zoning plan of the El Nido Marine Reserve are attached as Annex A and B, respectively.

This Order takes effect immediately.
