### TERMS OF REFERENCE

PROCUREMENT OF SUBJECT MATTER EXPERT FOR SYLLABUS TOPIC ON ANCESTRAL DOMAIN AND INDIGENOUS PEOPLE FOR THE DENR-UNDP/GEF PROJECT ON INTEGRATED APPROACH IN MANAGEMENT OF MAJOR BIODIVERSITY CORRIDORS IN THE PHILIPPINES OR BD CORRIDOR PROJECT

#### I. Background

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), with funding from the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and support from the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), is implementing the project entitled "Integrated Approach in Management of Major Biodiversity Corridors in the Philippines" or BD Corridor. The Project aims to operationalize integrated management of biodiversity corridors to generate multiple benefits including effective conservation of globally threatened species and high conservation value forests, reduce deforestation and degradation, and enhance local biodiversity—friendly livelihoods. This Project has four (4) components, namely:

- Component 1: Effective coordination and governance framework for integrated ecosystem management in the Philippines biodiversity corridors system;
- Component 2: Application of integrated network design and management of biodiversity corridors to ensure continued stability and sustainability of their biological, ecosystem services and socio-economic conservation values;
- Component 3: Community—based sustainable use and management systems in the two
  pilot biodiversity corridor systems in the Philippines; and
- Component 4: Knowledge management, gender mainstreaming, learning, monitoring and evaluation.

The sustainability and dissemination of innovations within protected areas (PAs), Ancestral Domains, local government units (LGUs), and other implementing entities hinge significantly on the capacity of LGUs and regional offices of National Government Agencies (R/NGAs) to incorporate project learnings and strategies in their core plans and programs. Consequently, capacity—building programs are essential for LGUs and other stakeholders, ensuring their awareness of recent developments and policies in environmental protection and biodiversity conservation for seamless integration into the Comprehensive Land Use Plan (CLUP).

The Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD), through the Environmental, Land Use and Urban Planning and Development Bureau (ELUPDB) has requested assistance from the Project to update selected Syllabus Topics. These topics include:

- A. Integrated Ecosystem Management (IEM);
- B. Integrating Forest Land Use into the CLUP:
- C. Biodiversity;
- D. Ancestral Domain and Indigenous People;
- E. Green Growth;
- F. Sustainable Land Management (SLM); and
- G. Gender Sensitivity and Responsiveness.

These modules have been used in training sessions for the preparation of CLUPs and Zoning Ordinances (ZOs) of LGUs. However, since its roll-out in 2015, these syllabus

topics have not undergone updates. Therefore, it is imperative to include new developments and policies to enhance their relevance and effectiveness.

#### II. Objective

The objective of hiring a Subject Matter Expert is to comprehensively review and enhance the existing Syllabus Topic on **Ancestral Domain and Indigenous People**, initially developed by the Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board (HLURB), now DHSUD, in 2015. The enhanced module shall be utilized in the capacity development of partners and stakeholders at the national, local, and corridor levels, aiming to provide up—to—date knowledge and strategies for effective environmental planning and management.

## III. Scope of Work

The scope of work outlined in this Terms of Reference (TOR) is beyond the optimum in-house capability of the procuring entity and is consistent with the Government's policy not to compete with the private sector as integrated in Item 2 of Annex "B" of the 2016 Implementing Rules and Regulation of RA 9184.

Specifically, the scope of services includes:

- Conducting desk research on current developments and practices in Ancestral Domain and Indigenous People;
- 2. Reviewing the existing Syllabus Topic on Ancestral Domain and Indigenous People developed by DHSUD;
- 3. Updating and enhancing the Syllabus Topic using DHSUD's format and incorporating the biodiversity corridor approach, as appropriate;
- 4. Presenting the updated Syllabus Topic for peer review and revising it based on inputs, recommendations, and post-training evaluations;
- 5. Developing training materials, including but not limited to presentations, videos, and workshop templates;
- 6. Serving as Resource Person and Facilitator on the Syllabus Topic during the actual training;
- 7. Preparing a comprehensive training report on the Syllabus Topic, inclusive of feedback from the participants; and
- 8. Performing other related tasks as may be assigned by the BD Corridor National Project Director and the National Project Manager.

## IV. Qualifications and Requirements

- 1. Master's Degree or Bachelor's Degree in environment and natural resource management, environmental science, biodiversity conservation, socio-economic development, political science, or other related fields;
- 2. At least five (5) years of experience in conducting capacity building related to the assigned topic;
- 3. At least five (5) years of experience collaborating with LGUs, Indigenous Peoples (IP) groups, and key lead implementing agencies including NCIP, DENR, DA, DTI, and CSO/NGO;
- 4. Submission of sample works directly aligned with the scope of work outlined in the TOR.

#### V. Timetable

The Subject Matter Expert shall work with BD Corridor National Project Management Unit (NPMU), Corridor Project Management Unit (CPMU), Biodiversity Management Bureau, and DHSUD ELUPDB for eight (8) months.
