TERMS OF REFERENCE

PROCUREMENT OF THE SERVICES OF AN INDIVIDUAL CONSULTANT ON SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL SAFEGUARDS FOR THE DENR-UNDP/GEF PROJECT ON INTEGRATED APPROACH IN MANAGEMENT OF MAJOR BIODIVERSITY CORRIDORS IN THE PHILIPPINES OR BD CORRIDOR

I. Background

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), with funding from the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and support from the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), is implementing the project entitled "Integrated Approach in Management of Major Biodiversity Corridors in the Philippines" or BD Corridor. The Project aims to operationalize integrated management of biodiversity corridors to generate multiple benefits including effective conservation of globally threatened species and high conservation value forests, reduce deforestation and degradation and enhance local biodiversity-friendly livelihoods. This Project has four components, namely:

- Component 1: Effective coordination and governance framework for integrated ecosystem management in the Philippines biodiversity corridors system;
- Component 2: Application of integrated network design and management of biodiversity corridors to ensure continued stability and sustainability of their biological, ecosystem services and socio-economic conservation values:
- Component 3: Community-based sustainable use and management systems in the two pilot biodiversity corridor systems in the Philippines; and
- Component 4: Knowledge management, gender mainstreaming, learning, monitoring and evaluation.

Safeguard policies are essential tools to prevent and mitigate undue harm to people and their environment in the development process. When identifying and designing a project, safeguards should help assess the possible environmental and social risks and the impacts (positive or negative) associated with a development intervention.

Safeguards policies also ensure the greater participation of local communities (particularly IP, rural women, farmers' groups, NGOs/CSOs/POs, private sector, etc.) at the policy, program, monitoring and evaluation, and knowledge management levels, including recognition of human rights, gender equality, and indigenous people's perspectives so that intended results are achieved at the end of the project implementation period and beyond.

II. Objective

The objective of procuring the services of an individual consultant on Social and Environmental Safeguards is to ensure the strict compliance of the BD Corridor Project with the Philippine government's social and environmental standard (SES)-related policies and the UNDP Social and Environmental Standards (SES).

III. Scope of Work

The scope of work of this Terms of Reference is beyond the optimum in-house capability of the procuring entity and is consistent with the Government's policy not to compete with the private sector as integrated in Item 2 of Annex "B" of the 2016 Implementing Rules and Regulation of RA 9184.

The SES will:

a) Ensure that the Project complies with UNDP Social and Environmental Safeguards (SES)

- b) Ensure that safeguard requirements are relayed to concerned partners and stakeholders to mainstream in the implementation activities of the different Project components;
- c) Provide overall guidance and facilitation in developing/implementing the project safeguard-related plans and Indigenous Peoples Framework;
- d) Ensure that planned and ongoing BD Corridor Project activities at the national and local levels are aligned with the updated safeguards-related management plans, including the SESP matrix, the Environmental Social Management Framework (ESMF), Gender Analysis and Gender Action Plan, Indigenous Peoples Planning Framework and Grievance Redress Mechanism, among others;
- e) Recommend risk mitigating processes that follow Strategic Environmental and Social Assessment (SESA) principles;
- f) Review and provide recommendations on project products/deliverables and services to be consistent with the BD Corridor Project's UNDP SES procedure;
- g) Coordinate the mainstreaming of social issues in project design and implementation in accordance with agreed safeguard instruments (Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF), Environmental and Social Management Plan (ESMP)

Specifically, this include the following tasks:

- Consult with concerned agencies/local stakeholders and update the SESP matrix and develop the necessary safeguards management plans, including the Process Framework, Environmental and Social Management FRamework (ESMF) and/or Indigenous Peoples Planning Framework (IPPF), whichever is applicable given the updated SESP matrix;
- Review, monitor and update the Project risk log, including identification and implementation of risk mitigation measures;
- Review and ensure that the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) is effectively established, rolled-out to all concerned stakeholders and implemented to ensure documentation and resolution of all grievances arising from project implementation;
- Review, provide recommendations and write reports related to SES compliance of project activities and outputs;
- Preparation of reports on private sector due diligence risk mitigation strategies at the national and corridor levels in coordination with EMBC PMU and Region XI and CARAGA Mines and Geo-Sciences Bureau (MGB); and,
- Prepare quarterly Safeguards Monitoring Report (SMR) for inclusion in the BD Corridor Accomplishment reports
- e) Perform other related tasks to safeguards monitoring and compliance with the Social and Environmental Screening Procedure (SESP) for the project.

- 4. Report on roll-out and implementation of GRM

- 6. Consolidated Final Report including previously submitted reports, with Executive Summary.

V. Minimum Qualification Requirements

1. Bachelor's degree in social science, agriculture, forestry, natural resources management,

- 2. With at least 3 years relevant experience in environmental and social safeguards management;
- 3. At least 2 years responsibility on developing and implementing plans aligned to UNDP SES, SESP, and related measures;
- 4. At least 2 years of experience working with IP, upland communities, farmers groups, private sector and with key lead implementing agencies including DENR, DA, NCIP, NGO/CSO related to social and environmental safeguards;
- 5. Has the ability to work effectively with government representatives, development partners, and indigenous peoples and/or local communities;
- 6. Good knowledge on environmental and social safeguards that can be relevant to the BD Corridor Project;
- 7. Must have demonstrated experience in documentation of consultations, meetings, etc. and report writing.

VI. Timetable

The Consultant is expected to deliver the outputs within 6 months after acceptance of Notice to Proceed (NTP).
